I was sent to a class filled with broken native children.




I didn't understand so I went to ask what was happening. Yet, I did not know a lot of English. So I accidentally spoke my native language.



What did you just say?

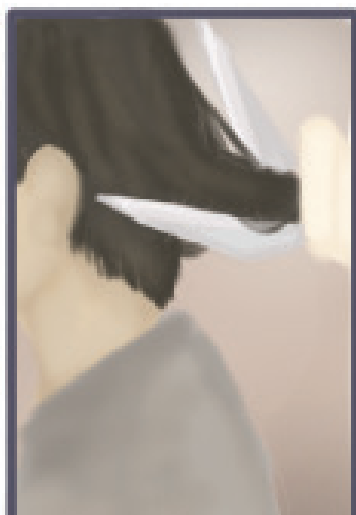
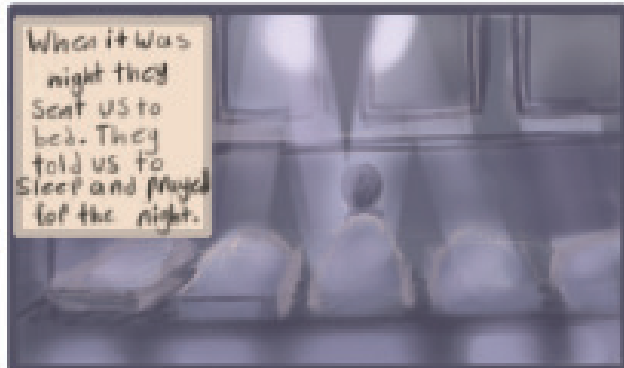

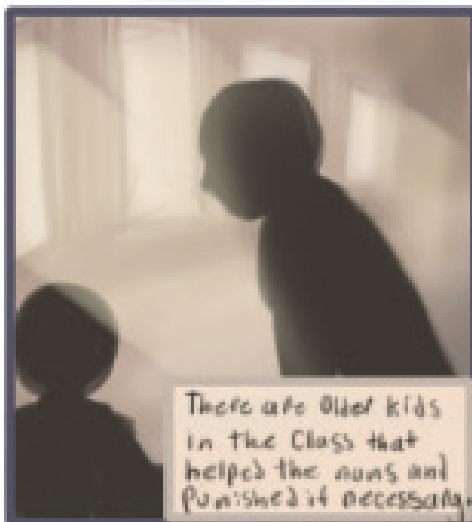


It is said that sometimes time cannot mend wounds, is it not?

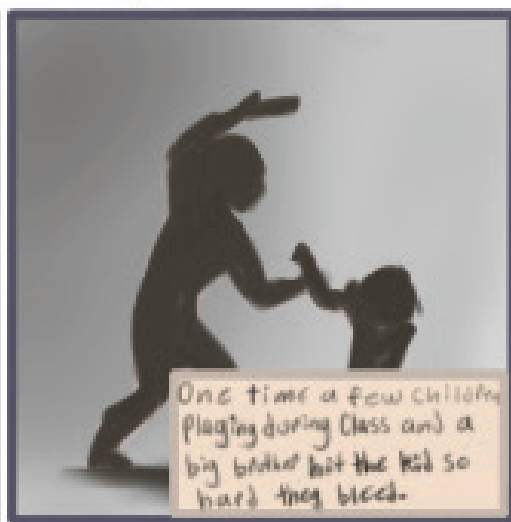
When it was
